Dear Graduate Students,

We would like to announce a call for graduate student posters for the upcoming **62nd Annual Conference of the Florida Educational Research Association (FERA)** to be held in **Cocoa Beach, Florida at the Hilton** on **November 15-17, 2017.** This conference is a great opportunity for graduate students to present their research on topics and issues of interest to education professionals. Whether you are a first-time presenter, or have presented before, the friendly and supportive atmosphere of this conference provides an ideal setting to present your research.

As your graduate student representatives, we would like to invite you to submit a proposal for a poster presentation by **September 1st** to <u>fera.student.proposal@gmail.com</u>. The due date for posters is the same as the deadline for papers and symposia for the regular program.

Graduate students are not limited to the poster session. Graduate students are welcome to submit proposals to the regular program. Please forward this call to any graduate students that you know who may be interested in this opportunity to present at FERA.

The guidelines for your proposal are very flexible; we simply ask that you keep the proposal **under 5 pages**, **double-spaced**, and that you be aware that we will be reviewing and judging the proposals and the final posters on the following six topics: **significance of research**, **theoretical framework**, **methods**, **analysis employed**, **interpretation of results**, **and quality of writing**. We also welcome in-progress research that you would like to share in order to get feedback at the conference. The authors of the top two posters will be recognized at the conference.

Remember that, if your poster proposal is accepted, you must register for the conference and pay for membership in FERA. Graduate students may pay \$80 for conference registration and membership in FERA at <u>http://feraonline.org/site/index.php/conference/registration/</u>. There will be opportunities for graduate students to *volunteer* during the conference. Confirmed volunteers will receive complimentary conference registration, but must still pay \$15 for graduate student membership (which may be paid at the same membership website).
