Greetings! We look forward to seeing you at the 55th Annual Meeting of the Florida Educational Research Association. The registration desk will open at 10 a.m. and the conference opening session will start at 12 noon on Wednesday November 17th, 2010. We are excited about the program which includes paper presentations by 49 research groups from around the state on a variety of educational issues, a graduate student poster session, and several invited sessions including a DOE symposium with members of the FCAT Technical Advisory Committee. We will also have presentations from:

Robert Meyer, Research Professor at the Wisconsin Center for Education Research (WCER). He is the Director of the Value-Added Research Center (VARC) and known for his research on value-added modeling and evaluation methods. Over the last decade and a half, Meyer has worked closely with districts and states to develop and apply innovative statistical methods.

Damian Betebenner, associate at The National Center for the Improvement of Educational Assessment in Dover, New Hampshire. His areas of specialization include applied statistics, particularly with regard to large scale data analysis. His current research interests center around longitudinal data analysis, specifically with regard to state and federal performance mandates.

There will be a social Wednesday evening, a social on Thursday evening, and a luncheon/business meeting to wrap up the conference on Friday, November 19th, 2010. During the business meeting there will be a vote on changes to the by-laws that are being proposed by the executive committee of FERA. The changes include the addition of explicit reference to training to make the purpose more obviously consistent with the definition of educational organizations in the government document on tax exempt status and alterations that allow some of the organization business to be conducted electronically (as opposed to only by paper mail). Please see the FERA website to download a copy of the by-law with proposed changes.

We hope you all can attend Friday's luncheon and business meeting. Please RSVP at the Registration Desk (sign-up list available) if you plan to attend Friday's luncheon as we need to obtain an accurate count for the hotel. The lunch is provided by the organization to those who attend the conference, but if you are bringing a guest that has not registered for the conference, we are asking you to by a lunch ticket for the guest, which can be done through the FERA website http://feraonline.org.

Room reservations at the reduced conference rate will be available until October 16th - please make your hotel reservations early! Note that the organization benefits from your stay at the conference hotel. The meeting rooms are provided under the restriction that the organization purchases food and beverages from the hotel (e.g., the socials and luncheon) and that our members fill a block of rooms. Consequently, it is important that they know you are part of FERA when you register.
